FHWA - Central Federal Lands Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP)

BACKGROUND

- New funding program in Federal Transportation Bill (MAP-21)
- Provides funding for work on public facilities that are located on, are adjacent to, or provide access to Federal lands
- Projects awarded funding through a competitive 'Call for Projects'

PROJECT ELIGIBILITY

- Endorsed by Rocky Mountain National Park as a high priority
- Provides access to Federal high-use recreation sites
- Improves safety while improving access to a Federal facility
- Ability to meet the local match requirements

Downtown Estes Loop project was awarded \$13 Million in FLAP funds in September 2013

CDOT - Responsible Acceleration of Maintenance and Partnerships (RAMP)

BACKGROUND

- New CDOT approach, known as RAMP, intended to coordinate project expenditures and available funding
- Promotes public-private partnerships including the transfer of ownership of certain CDOT roadways to a local agency with demonstrated support to and willingness to take ownership and maintenance
- CDOT required to provide local agency funding to bring roadway up to appropriate standards and condition prior to transferring ownership and maintenance
- Projects selected through a competitive project application and selection process

West Elkhorn Avenue, west of Moraine Avenue, was awarded \$4.2 Million in RAMP funds in October 2013
